Minutes

August 19, 2021

6:00 pm

- 1. Meeting called to order at 6: 05pm
- 2. Roll call was taken by Darrel James. Representatives present included the following: Danielle Graham, Joseph Blue, Keosha Lamb, Re'Shaun Blake, Melissa Miller, Katisa Donaldson and Shaquilla Johnson.

Capital Area Community Action Agency staff and guest present included the following people: Kristin Reshard, Darrel James, Tim Center, Venita Treadwell and Cynthia Valencic.

3. Quorum was established.

4. Consent

a. <u>Minutes-</u> The minutes were reviewed by members of Policy Council. Minutes were adopted.

5. Action Items

a. <u>Financial Report-</u> Cynthia Valencic reviewed the financial report and the attached Financial Statement Narrative (see attached). Revenue and expenditures are at 73% and 70% respectively. We are in the budget benchmarks. Non-federal share match is at 76%. Medical/ dental supplies are over budget but can be worked out at the end of the year. The Lowe's credit card bill is higher this month due to repairs underway at the centers in preparation for the beginning of school.

A motion to accept the fiscal report was made by Joseph Blue and seconded by Katisa Donaldson. Vote taken and all in favor. Motion passed and approved.

b. <u>Personnel Actions</u>— Ms. Treadwell is bringing 6 personnel actions to the meeting for approval. Mia Cummings in Franklin County (teacher), Yolanda Tally at Mabry Head Start (Asst. teacher), Chrishenda Jones (Asst. teacher/ VPK) and Rose Cassius (VPK teacher) at Louise B. Royal, Debra Warner at South City (cook) and Letisha Berry- Rolle at South City (Teacher asst.)

A motion to approve the new hires in block was made by Katisa Donaldson and was seconded by Reshaun Blake. Vote taken and all in favor. Motion passed and approved.

6. Director's Report

Tim reviewed the attached report (see attached). Tim reported 184 children reported to class on the first day of school, however another 70 is needed. The Pre-k offered by the school system is also under enrolled. The pandemic and hesitancy is most likely the cause. Tim asked the Council members to share any ideas for recruitment. We will eventually be moving in the new wing of the old High School in Franklin County. Tim reminded the parents of the benefits of utilizing H.A.T.C.H. at home.

- 7. <u>Center Updates-</u> Danielle Graham stated that drop off and pick up was fine, however a few parents had a few concerns with the process of turning in paperwork beforehand. Darrel stated that parents are aware of paperwork needed prior to the start of school however not all utilize the time provided during the summer. Darrel also stated we now have access to immunizations via the database for the students. Joseph Blue stated everything went well at Mabry for the first day but a few parents still complained about now being able to enter the classroom but understood it was for safety purposes. Shaquilla stated everything was good in Jefferson and staff was welcoming.
- 8. <u>Office of Head Start Updates:</u> Darrel James reviewed the information memorandum in the packet from Office of Head Start addressing some terminology changes. (Please see memorandum in packet)
- 9. <u>Chairperson's Report:</u> No chairperson's report at this time.
- 10. Other Business: Melissa Miller was grateful and excited she was able to get VPK and her daughter can stay until 5:00 p.m. Tim encouraged more parents to sign up for the extended day program.
- 11. The meeting was adjourned 6:45 p.m.

Head Start Financial Statement Narrative For the Ten Months Ending July 31, 2021 Capital Area Community Action Agency

As of July 31, 2021, we have completed ten months of the fiscal year and, as a benchmark, we would expect the year-to-date actual expenses and revenue to be around 84%. At month end, the Year to Date Actual Revenue and Expenses are 76% and 76% respectively with a mostly restricted income of \$32,517.

Year to Date Non-Federal Share (NFS) Match reported totals \$412,149 of the \$512,345 total match required for the grant period ending September 30, 2021.

Expenditure Variances and Explanations

The Head Start Statement of Revenue and Expenditures tracks year-to-date progress by budget line item. Actual revenues and expenditures are compared to the original budget for each budget line item by amount and percentage. Some budget line items may be below or above the expected percentage at any given point in the year. This can be caused by something as innocuous as the revenue or expense occurring unevenly at different points of time during the year, such as a one-time insurance payment. In other words, one ninth of every budget item is not necessarily paid each month. Therefore, when there is a significant variance, explanations are provided. It is important to note that, while a specific line item may be over budget, the overall Agency budget should not be over budget. Adjustments are often made at the end of a grant or fiscal year to ensure that all budgets are balanced.

Office Supplies – is over the benchmark budget due to a large number of Covid-related purchases.

<u>Medical / Dental Supplies –</u> is over budget due to a purchase of needed supplies. While the percentage is high, the original budget was only \$500 so the overage is \$395.

<u>Postage and Delivery Expense-</u> is over the benchmark budget with a number of start of the school year mailings. This number should finish right on track.

<u>Contractural Services – Health / Disabilities –</u> is over benchmark budget due to the needs of the students. After the close of the school year, staff may determine that more funds are need on the line item to properly start the new school year.

<u>Repairs & Bldg Maintenance – Recurring –</u> is over benchmark budget but when combined with nonrecurring, the total is at 77% and right on budget.

<u>Technology</u> - is currently over the benchmark budget due a budget adjustment but should stay under budget for the year.

<u>Dues and Subscriptions</u> – is over budget due to a number of subscription expenses necessary in response to Covid.

Head Start Financial Statement Narrative For the Ten Months Ending July 31, 2021 Capital Area Community Action Agency

<u>Equipment (\$5,000 or More)</u> – is at budget after the budget amendment. No other expenses are expected here for the remainder of the year.

<u>Expendable Equipment</u> – is slightly over the benchmark budget due to the replacement of several computers.

<u>Meetings/Workshops / Trainings</u> – is over the budget but when combined with Training Staff Development, it is well within the parameters.

<u>Advertising</u> – is over budget primarily due to an advertising campaign to attract new students to the program.

The following memo serves as my update to the Community Action Head Start Policy Council and Board of Directors.

Staffing

With the opening of classes, there has been continued monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms and test results. Several classrooms and one center have had to close for quarantine. Managing with the Department of Health has resulted in our ability to continue to provide services.

Facilities

Once finalized, Franklin renovations will commence and a lease is signed. A new playground will go in at Franklin's location. Bathroom design is holding the project up.

Curriculum

Implementation of the Creative Curriculum indicates positive outcomes for students with a significant majority showing kindergarten readiness for the four-year old students. HATCH was shared with all families to encourage learning at home. This has been very helpful in cases where families are quarantined away from the Center.

Enrollment

Staff continue to enroll and registering students for the coming year. More than half of the slots are filled.

Federal and State Regulations

Community Action Head Start continues to work with and follow local health and education regulations.

Corrective Action and Follow Up

- COVID-19 Policy and Procedure: Policy and Procedure have been updated to address COVID-19.
- Funded Enrollment: Office of Head Start states that funded enrollment must be met by January 2022. Currently we are at 251. Franklin County will open with 20 slots available, but the remaining 16 will not be filled until the new facility is opened in January 2022. Franklin may cause an issue with the program meeting its funded enrollment.
- Extended Day: After School slots are available at Louise B. Royal, Mabry, and South City. No families have enrolled at South City, but families are enrolled at Louise B. Royal and Mabry.
- **Orientation:** Orientation was a success for all head start centers. One hundred eighty-seven families were in attendance via zoom.

Strengths

- Glick grant was awarded to assist families with COVID related issues
- Program makes use of Zoom and ChildPlus to keep families engaged with the program
- We met our Average Daily Attendance for August.
- More families seem to be interested in attending Head Start.







EAGLE: Engaging Advocates and Governance Leadership Executives is the most recent version of T/TAS at WKU's highly sought-after Head Start/Early Head Start program governance training program.

Strong leadership and governance is a critical component of any Head Start/Early Head Start program. Current events necessitate an informed, engaged group of leaders that understand the requirements, responsibilities, and opportunities afforded by becoming a guiding voice for the program. **EAGLE** focuses on how the role of decision makers involves oversight, total engagement and fundamental governance skills. It provides detailed information to enable members of the Governing Body, policy group(s), and the management team to articulate their roles and responsibilities in the overall operation of the program.

The shared governance model is empowering, educational, and promotes equity. **EAGLE** participants with no governance background will be prepared to contribute to important conversations and make critical decisions for program development. Participants with previous experience will better understand the intricacies of federal grant administration, state and local requirements, as well as working cooperatively with stakeholder leadership. Participant staff supporting Governance activities will better understand the role they play in providing quality data and input which best informs program decision makers. Staff will also be better prepared to provide governance training.

In addition to fulfilling the federally mandated training requirement for newly elected Governing Body and Policy Council members, this session also reviews the fundamentals of parliamentary procedure; discusses innovative engagement strategies for members and families; and tackles conducting governance activities in the new normal of COVID-19. There is also a focus on incorporating equity into program development. This is an important and timely training for anyone involved in program governance.

EAGLE is a two-part virtual training applicable to any Head Start/Early Head Start grantee. Whether staff working with parents and community representatives or new members of the Governing Body, Policy Council, and Parent Committee, this training supports development of confident leaders that will safeguard your program and support services that best serve your community. Join seasoned trainers Robin Gadsden-Dupree and Krystal Heinzen Lindsey for **EAGLE**: **Engaging Advocates and Leadership Executives**. Participants will receive the *EAGLE*: *Engaging Advocate and Leadership Executives* workbook that supports the training and includes relevant regulations and other useful resources.
