2025 Community Needs Assessment

Capital Area Community Action Agency, Inc. is dedicated to helping people become self-sufficient and live prosperous lives. The agency serves a region comprised of eight rural and suburban counties. Over the past few years after suffering through the pandemic, major storms, inflation, the government shutdown, and a recessive economy, public demands for service from the agency continue to grow.

The census shows 436,731 people live in the 4,890.66 square mile report area defined for this assessment according to the 5-year estimates of the U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey 2019–23. Demographic data helps to inform the agency’s board of directors and program staff to help make better strategic decisions focusing on the most vulnerable populations while working to maximize efforts to support true transformational change for residents to move out of poverty.

The agency receives federal funding from the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG), which requires it to conduct a community needs assessment every five years. The enclosed assessment satisfies this requirement. After an analysis of this assessment, the agency will continue to carry forward strategic plan initiatives from the past, while exploring new opportunities for growth and service to the communities it serves.

Executive Summary

Section 1 of the report give a demographic overview of the total eight county service area. It compares the population by gender, age, race and ethnicity, and identifies the number of residents in poverty for each demographic. Section 2 includes the demographic and socio-economic profile of the residents by county. It identifies key needs and challenges, and recommendations and action priorities for each county.

Key Issues & Challenges

Counties in the service area have the same needs and challenges. Data shows them as follows:

- Infrastructure, Transportation & Rural Disadvantage

Rural geography, long commutes, limited public transit, and potential broadband/digital access gaps magnify the disadvantage for low-income residents in reaching jobs, services and education.

- Housing Stability and Cost Burden

Even though homeownership is relatively high in the area, low-income households may struggle with maintenance, aging housing stock, or seasonal/part-time incomes. Rental households may face cost burdens or sub-standard living conditions; the rental market in a rural coastal county may be limited.

- Economic Opportunity & Livable Wages

A sizeable portion of the population is living at or below poverty, indicating limited access to stable, well-paying employment. Given the rural geography of most of the counties, employment opportunities may be fewer, seasonal (tourism, fishing, coastal industries) or less diversified.

- Education & Skills Building

The relatively low levels of post-secondary education and higher share of adults without a high school diploma suggest a mismatch between workforce skills and job opportunities. Without targeted adult education, credentialing, work-based learning or career pathways, low-income residents are at a disadvantage.

- Health & Basic Needs

The uninsured rate and likely health disparities mean that low-income residents may face unmet health needs, which in turn limit ability to work or attend school. Rural geography may compound access issues. Also, basic services like childcare, reliable transportation, internet access may be under-resourced in low-income households.

- Coordination and Targeted Outreach

Services may be available, but low-income residents may face awareness, trust, transportation, eligibility or referral barriers. Coordination among nonprofits, local government, and service providers may be needed to ensure connected pathways rather than fragmented supports.

Recommendations & Action Priorities

Recommendation A: Promote Housing Stability & Infrastructure Equity

- Expand rental assistance or cost-burden relief programs for low-income households facing high rent burdens.
- Offer home-maintenance and energy-efficiency upgrade programs for low-income homeowners to reduce utility burden and preserve housing affordability.
- Improve transit options in low-income neighborhoods (bus, shuttle services) and ensure reliable connectivity to employment, education, health services.
- Leverage broadband/high-connectivity levels to expand remote-work opportunities, tele-education and telehealth for low-income residents.

Recommendation B: Expand Economic Opportunity & Workforce Pathways

- Develop or expand job-training programs in the county aligned with local economic sectors (tourism/hospitality, fisheries/aquaculture/coastal industries, construction, health care, technology).
- Partner with local employers to create apprenticeships, internships, and paid work experiences for low-income residents and youth.
- Provide wrap-around supports (transportation stipends, childcare, mentorship) so low-income adults can engage in training or employment.
- Encourage micro-enterprise, entrepreneurship among low-income households, especially given potential for local small business (tourism, guest services, local craft/fisheries markets) via coaching and small grants.

Recommendation C: Strengthen Education, Youth Supports & Adult Learning

- Expand adult education and credentialing opportunities accessible locally or via hybrid/remote models for low-income residents.
- Increase early childhood education access and after-school/summer enrichment for children in poverty, to support school readiness and long-term success.
- Partner with regional colleges, technical schools, and community organizations to build clear career-pathway programs for youth and adults in low-income households.

Recommendation D: Improve Access to Health, Wellness & Basic Services

- Increase outreach and enrollment efforts for health insurance and coverage among uninsured; establish mobile clinics or telehealth services to reach remote parts of the county.
- Expand mental health and substance-use supports, especially for low-income populations who may face stress, isolation, or barriers to care.
- Address food insecurity by expanding food pantries, mobile food delivery, community gardens, and school-based nutrition supports particularly in high-poverty areas.
- Ensure low-income residents have access to broadband and devices, enabling remote work, online education, telehealth, and access to services.

Recommendation E: Coordination and Targeted Outreach

- Engage residents living in poverty in the design and evaluation of programs to ensure services are culturally responsive, accessible, and meet real needs.
- Coordinate across sectors—nonprofits, government agencies, health systems, educational institutions—to reduce duplication, increase access and create seamless support pathways.
- Develop data-collection systems to track progress (poverty reduction, employment outcomes, educational attainment, housing stability) and refine interventions over time.
- Focus on place-based strategies—prioritize neighborhoods or coastal communities with higher poverty levels to concentrate resources and create visible impact.


SECTION I – TOTAL SERVICE AREA DATA

Education

Attainment - Overview

Educational Attainment shows the distribution of the highest level of education achieved in the report area, and helps schools and businesses to understand the needs of adults, whether it be workforce training or the ability to develop science, technology, engineering, and mathematics opportunities. Educational attainment is calculated for persons over 25 years old, and is an estimated average for the period from 2019 to 2023.

For the selected area, 22.10% have at least a college bachelor's degree, while 25.30% stopped their formal educational attainment after high school.

Adult Literacy

Literacy data published by the Program for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies (PIACC) breaks adult literacy into three different "Levels". Those reported as Level 1 are at risk for being able to understand printed material. Those at the upper end of Level 1 can read and understand the text well enough to be able to perform small task, but might have difficulty understanding or drawing inferences from multiple forms of text. Those at the lower end may struggle with basic vocabulary or even be functionally illiterate.

Access - Head Start

Head Start is a program designed to help children from birth to age five who come from families at or below poverty level. The program's goal is to help children become ready for kindergarten while also providing the needed requirements to thrive, including health care and food support.

This indicator reports the number and rate of Head Start program facilities per 10,000 children under age 5. Head Start facility data is acquired from the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) 2024 Head Start locator. Population data is from the 2020 US Decennial Census. The report area has a total of 29 Head Start programs with a rate of 13.57 per 10,000 children under 5 years old.

Housing Costs - Cost Burden (30%)

This indicator provides information on the cost of monthly housing expenses for owners and renters. The information offers a measure of housing affordability and excessive shelter costs. The data also serve to aid in the development of housing programs to meet the needs of people at different economic levels. The data also serve to aid in the development of housing programs to meet the needs of people at different economic levels.

Housing Quality - Substandard Housing

This indicator reports the number and percentage of owner and renter-occupied housing units, having at least one of the following conditions: 1) lacking complete plumbing facilities, 2) lacking complete kitchen facilities, 3) with 1 or more occupants per room, 4) selected monthly owner costs as a percentage of household income greater than 30%, and 5) gross rent as a percentage of household income greater than 30%. Selected conditions provide information in assessing the quality of the housing inventory and its occupants. This data is used to easily identify homes where the quality of living and housing can be considered substandard. Of the 172,917 total occupied housing units in the report area, 56,596 or 32.73% have one or more substandard conditions.
